



Student Satisfaction Survey 2020-21

Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) is one of the obligatory criteria set by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). It is also a pre qualifier for Assessment and Accreditation of the institution. From 2017 onwards the NAAC has endeavored to carry out a Student Experience Survey, the results of which will go into the accreditation process. The Survey includes 21 competency based, objective and subjective questions, rated on five point scale from 0 to 4. The responses to which are given anonymously by students of the institution. This survey corresponds to an institution level feedback on curriculum, infrastructure, teaching, learning, and evaluation experience.

Due to covid-19, we implemented SSS of 2020-21 on -line through students groups during the month of July, 2021 and received on-line from **682** students and analyzed by the feedback committee and reported to the head of the institute. The observations of SSS are as follows:

- Students appreciated teaching and implementation of learning outcome based curriculum which includes continuous evaluation and assessment of students throughout the semester.
- Majority of the students were glad about the quantum of syllabus covered in their classes and laboratories.
- They have expressed satisfaction over the illustrations of teachers for explaining Concepts through ICT tools.
- Teacher's preparation, communication, use of appropriate teaching pedagogy and fairness of internal evaluation has been rated high in the survey.

The SSS has also pointed out few areas where the college/ teachers/ departments do have scope for enhancement in quality of education. They are as follows:

- ❖ Institute needs to promote internship, student exchange and field visit opportunities.
- ❖ Formulate mechanism which will identify strength and weakness of students and provide them right level of challenges and help them to overcome their weakness.
- ❖ Enhance use of advanced ICT based teaching and equip laboratories with multiple copies of small instruments.
- ❖ Teachers should encourage research culture amongst students.
- ❖ More emphasis on skill development and hands on assignments, inclusion of seminars, workshops and field visits for at least in one core subject.
- ❖ Active mentorship especially for career guidance.
- ❖ Guidance and workshops on competitive exams like JAM, PG CET, and PG entrance.

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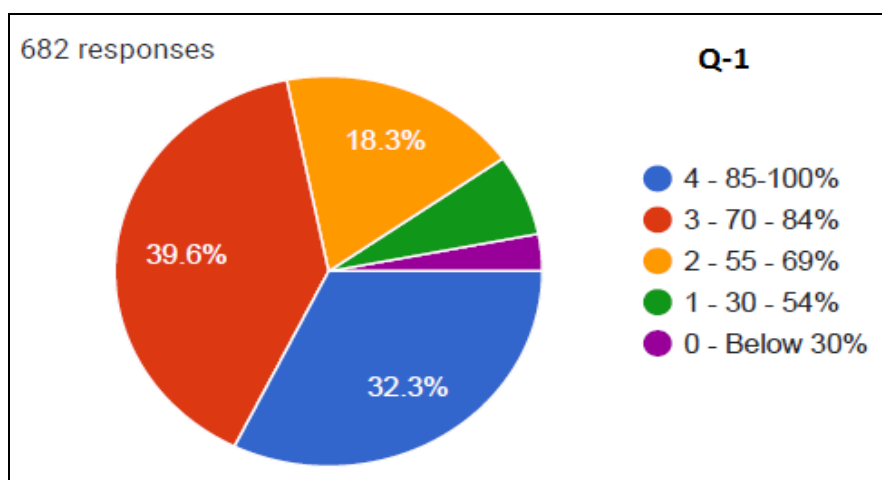




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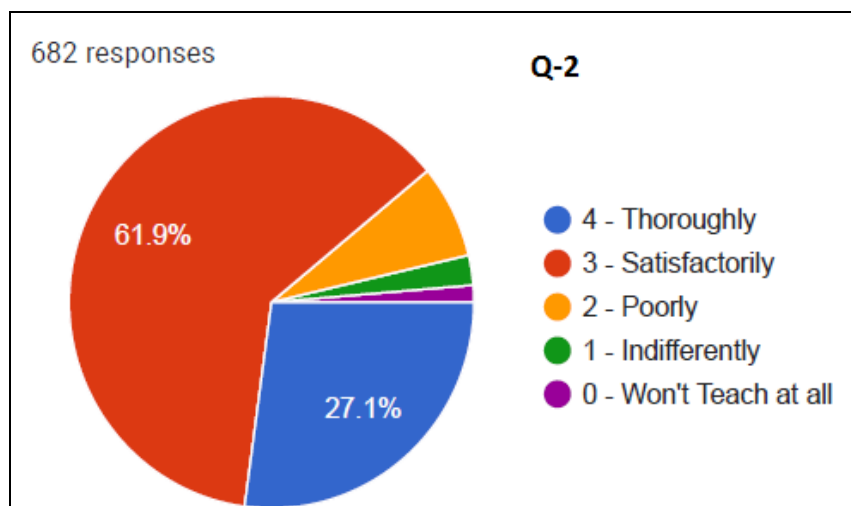
1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?

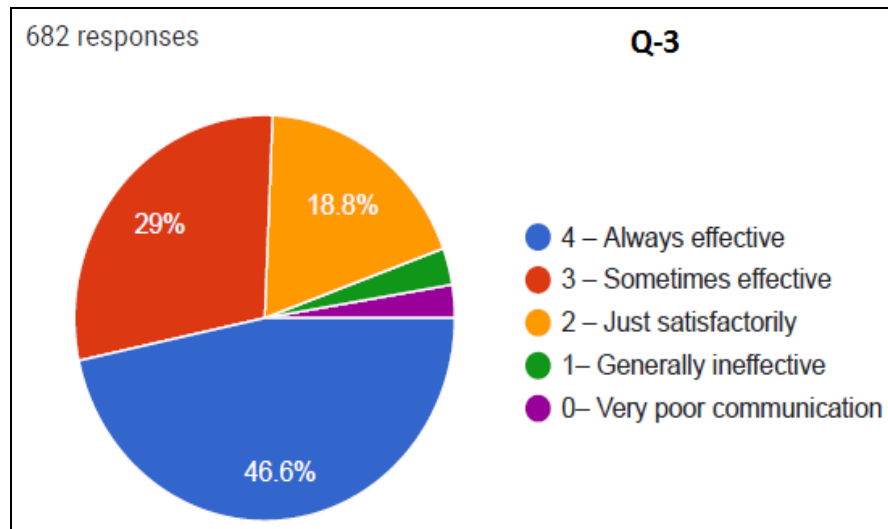
2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes?

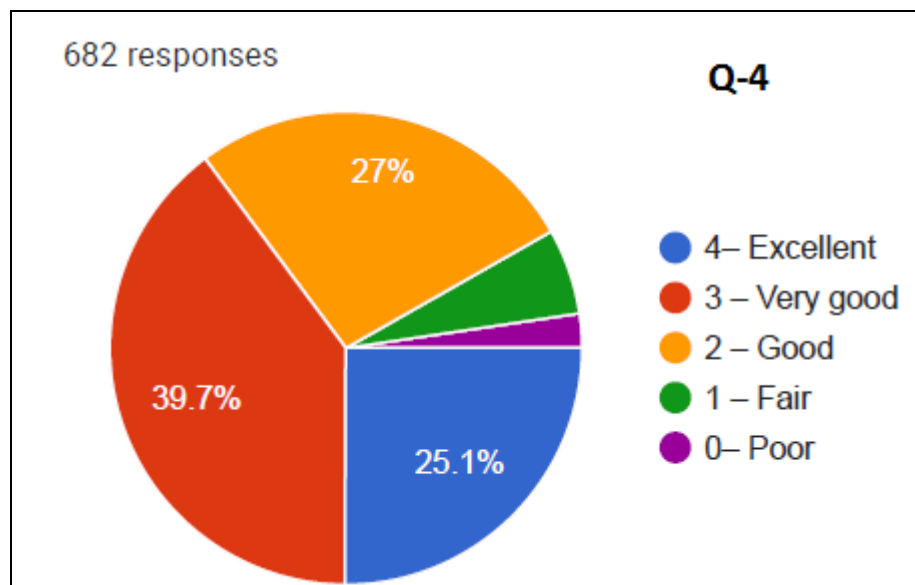
3. How well were the teachers able to communicate?

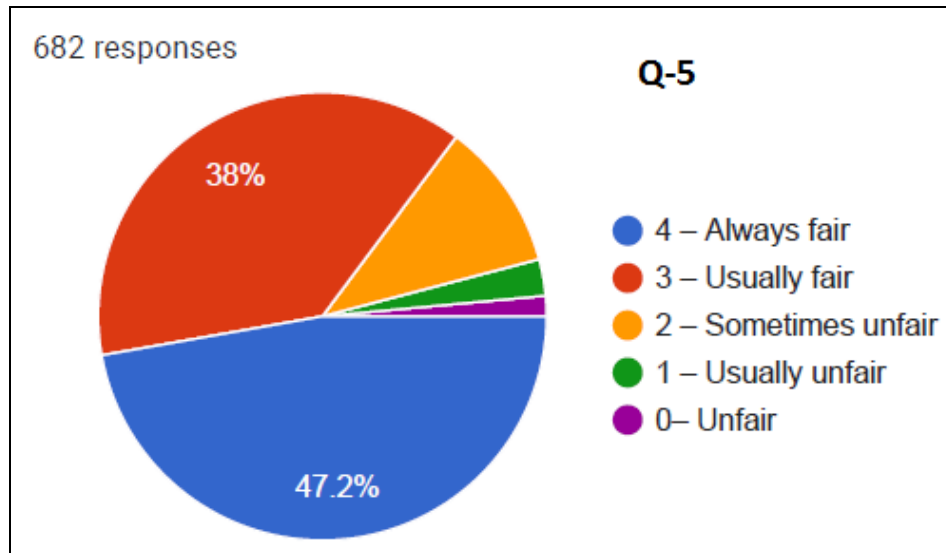
4. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as

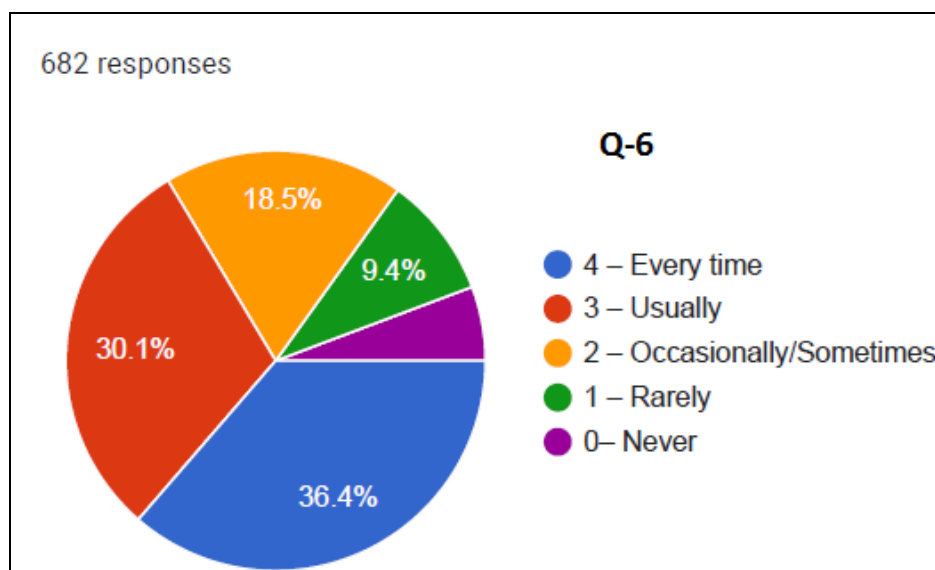
5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers.

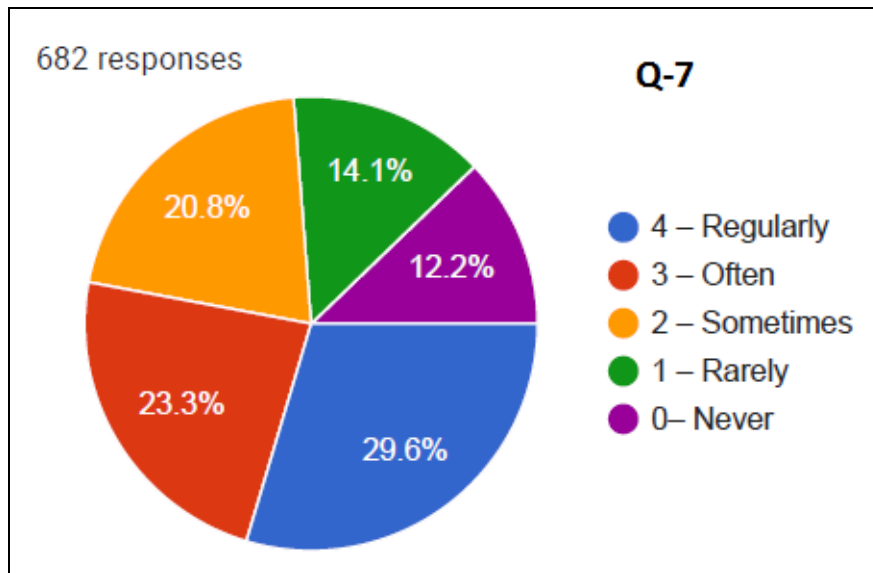
6. Was your performance in assignments discussed with you?

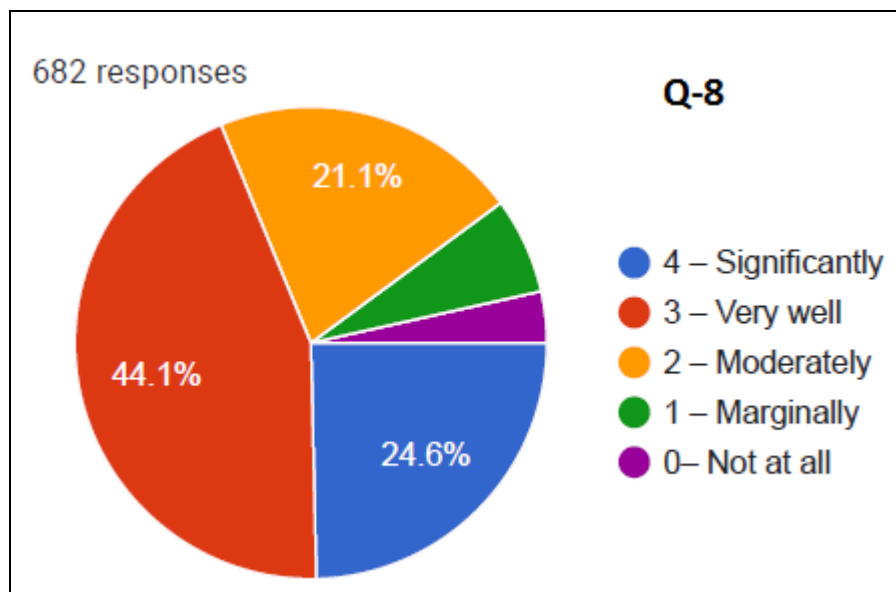
7. The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for students.

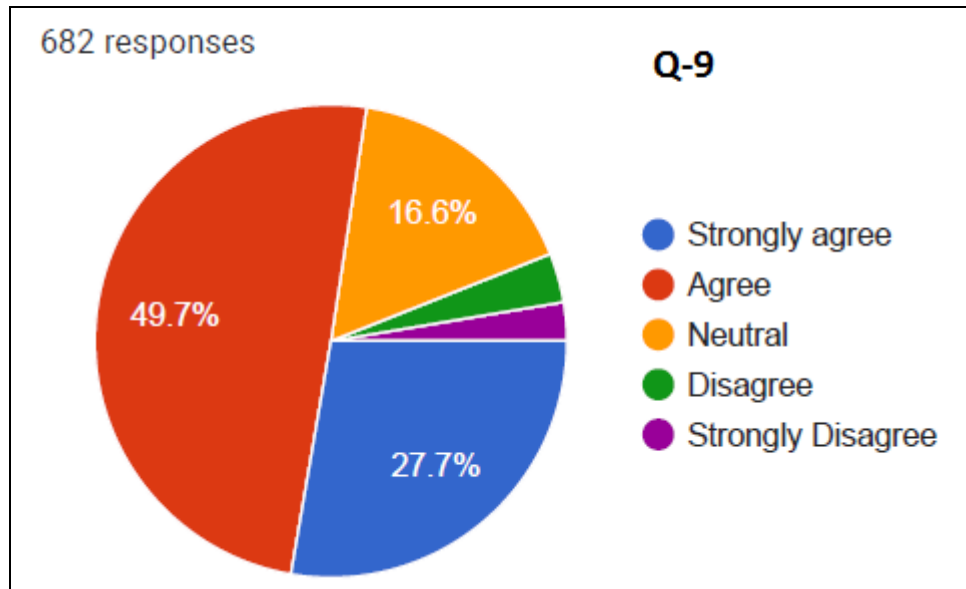
8. The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.

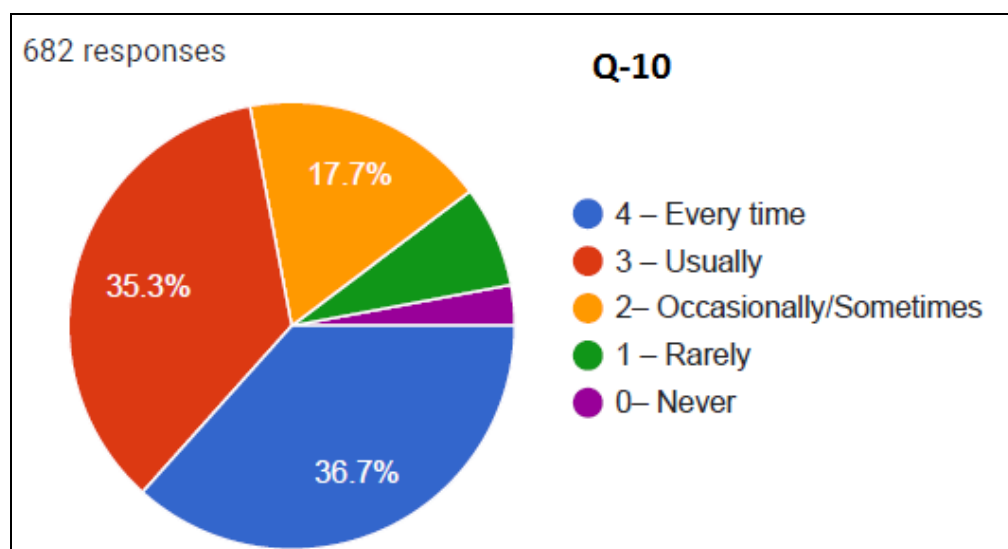

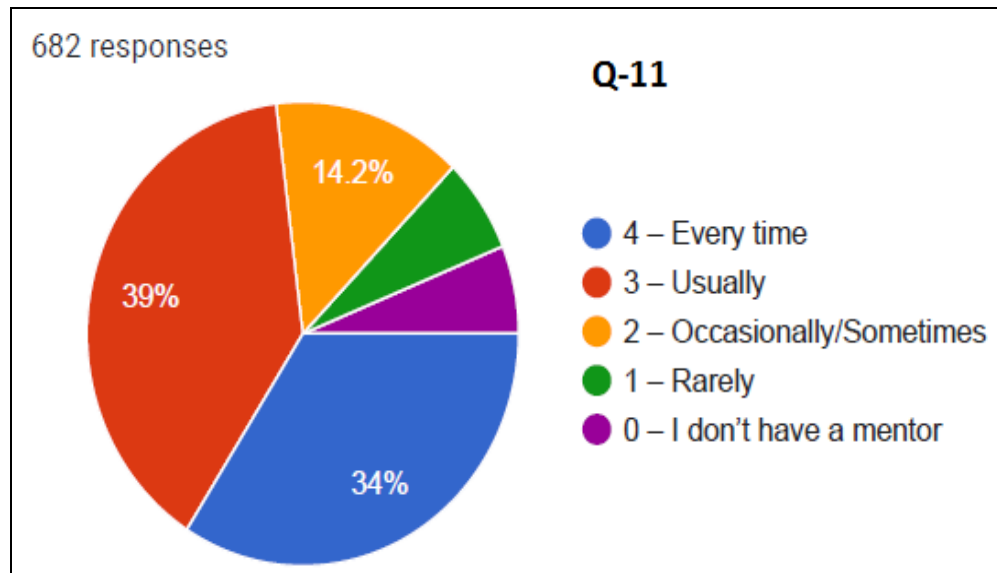

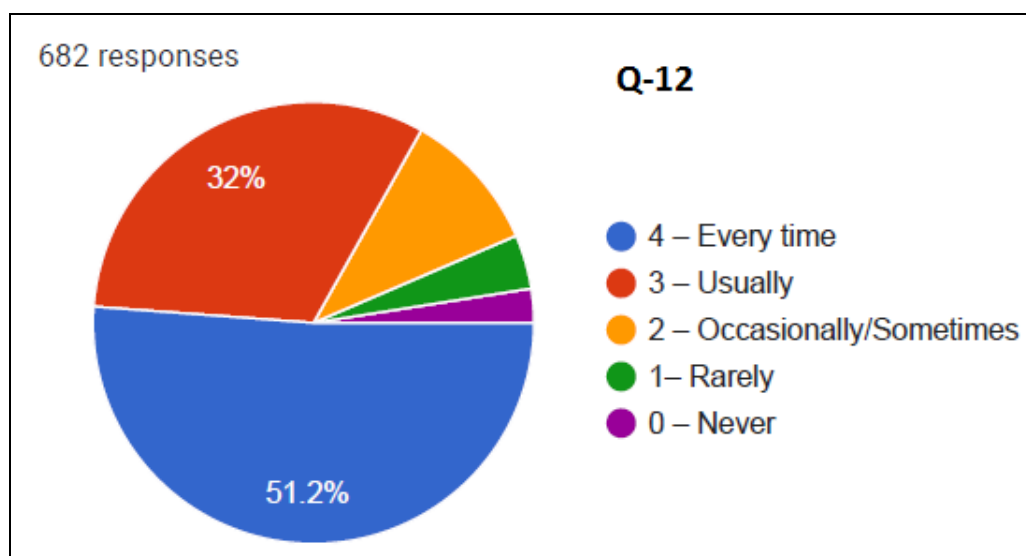

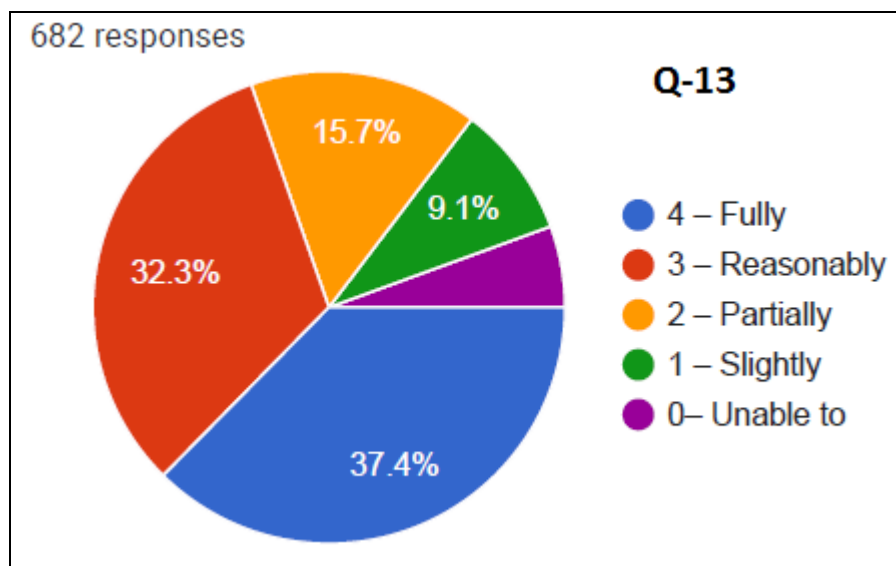
12. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications.

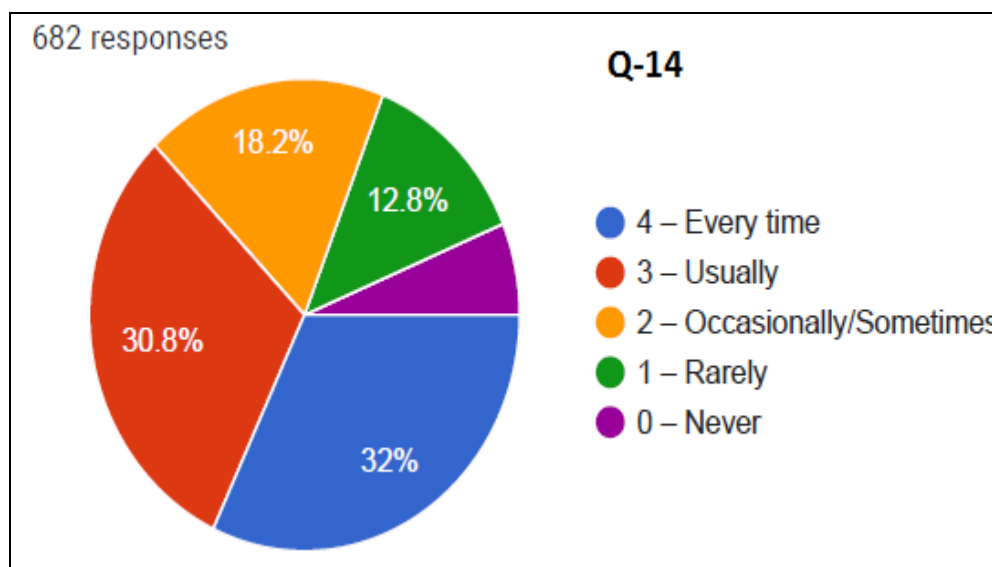
13. The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges.

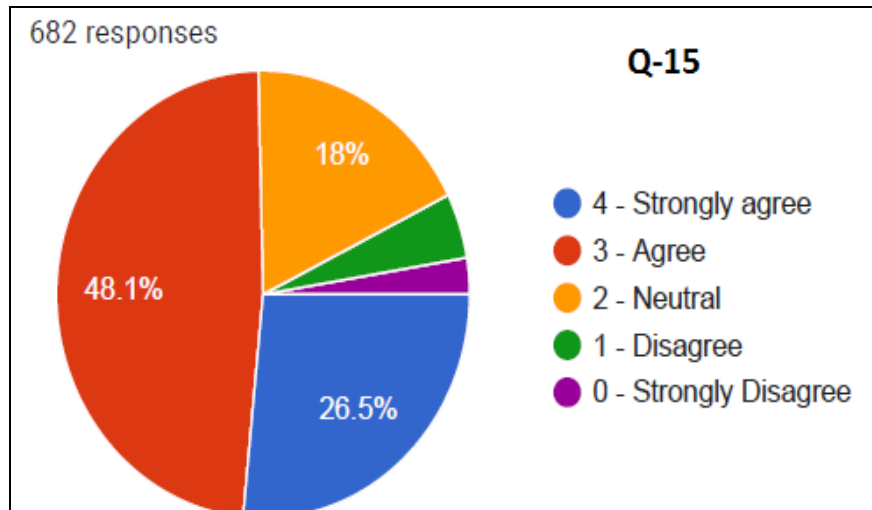
14. Teachers are able to identify your weaknesses and help you to overcome them.

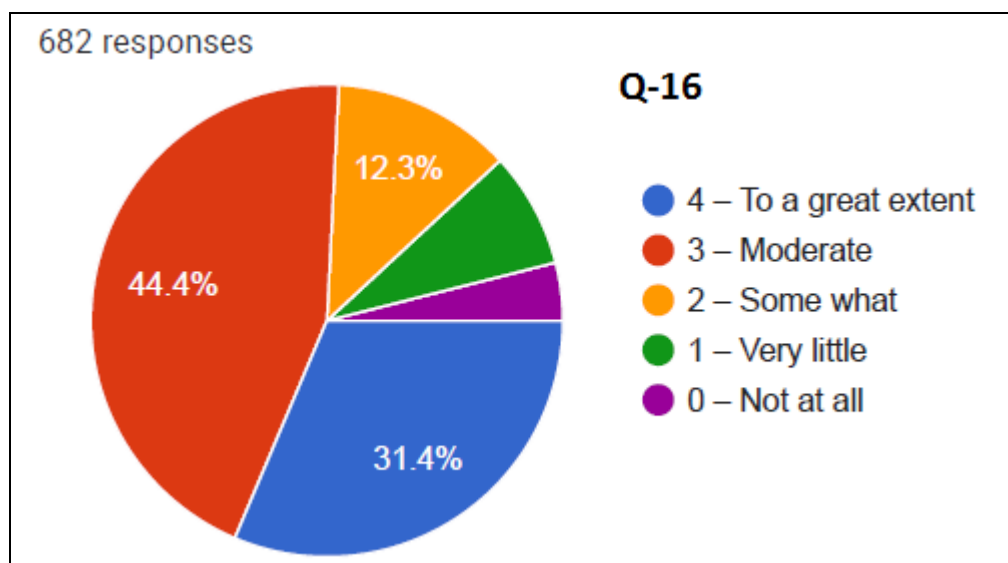

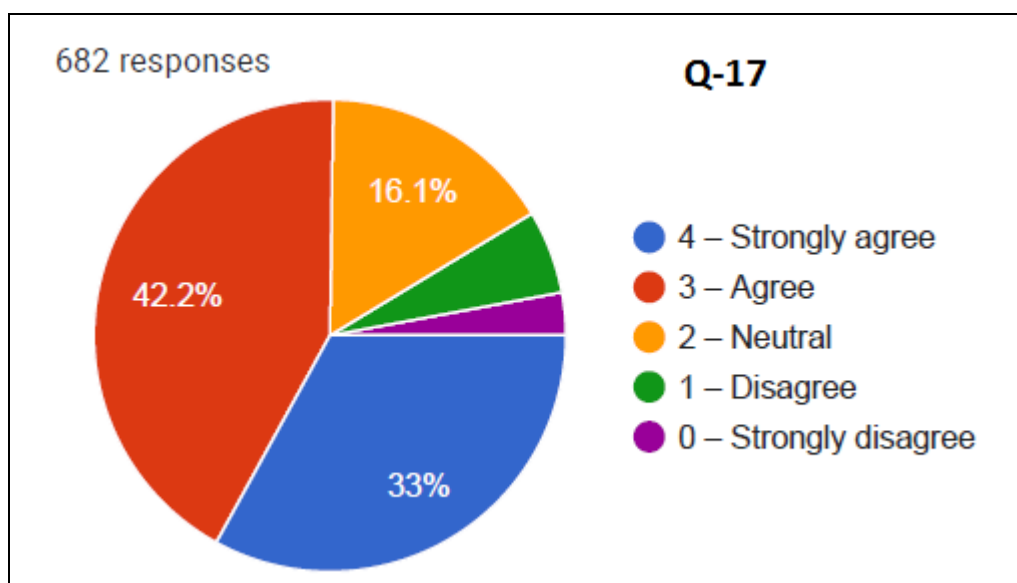

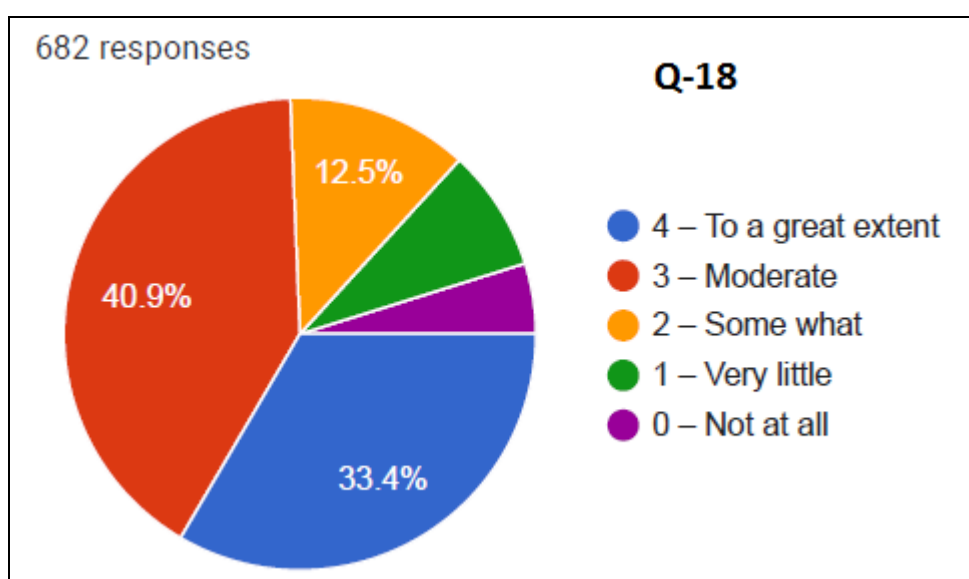
17. Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities

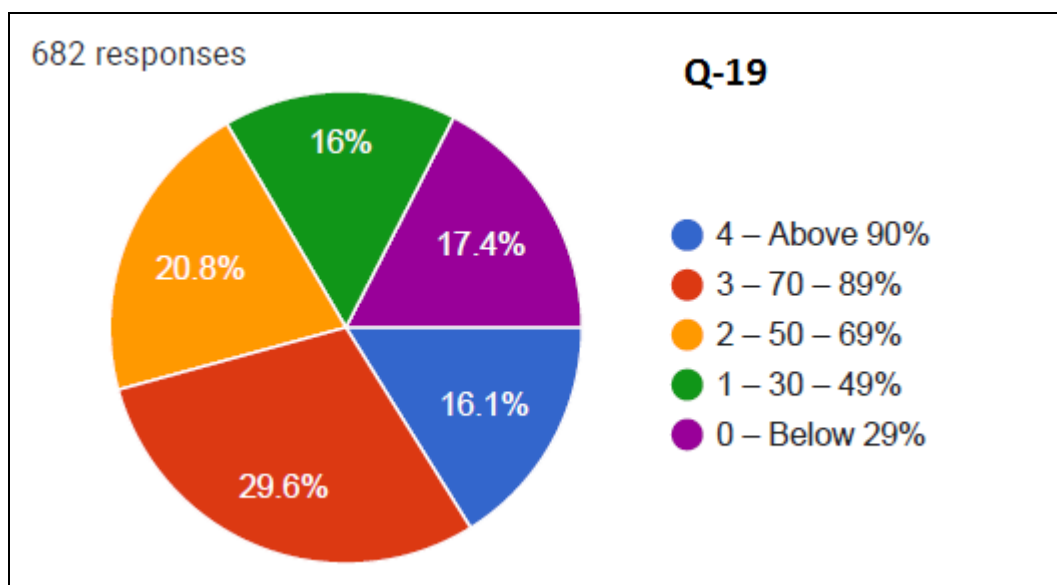
